**REPORT FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

*Shalom fellow congregants. Here are some highlights from our June meeting:*

- The 2024-2025 budget was approved by the Board of Trustees. A new budget will be prepared when the building is sold.
- \$19,000 was donated to the Community Tzedakah Fund this past year.
- 2/3 of the membership have already paid the security assessment. We look forward to 100% participation.
- There is a new kiddush request form that has been put in place. Kiddushim have been booked through September. Please contact the office if you would like to sponsor a kiddush.
- Work on the boiler will start in the next few weeks.
- The first draft of the website is complete; assistance is needed to create content. In the Fall, members will have access to a “members only” interactive part of the website on which they can pay their bills, make donations, and update their information. The Executive Committee and the Board will be testing these features before a full rollout begins for the entire congregation.
- Two of the chairlifts have been repaired.
- We need to be in compliance with Local Law 97 (building codes must be inspected) and a consulting firm will be hired.
- Sisterhood reported that they are planning for next year. The paid-up member luncheon is on October 28.
- Men’s Club reported that the annual fishing trip is coming up (looking to catch gefiltes), as well as the Men’s Club Shabbat. The annual paid-up BBQ is on September 15. Everyone is invited to the NY Mets game on July 10th versus the Washington Nationals.
- The HJC golf outing is on Monday, September 16.
- Youth and Family reported that the Teen Keshet event dinner took place at the Kogan house. The Junior Congregation dinner in the Moreida is upcoming.
- There was outreach to all bulletin advertisers. If you know local businesses that would like to place an ad, please see the pricing guide on the inside cover of the bulletin and reach out to the Executive Director with information.
- The upcoming Dinner honoring the Kogan family will include a journal.
- The Nuchum Avelim Committee will try to ensure that there is a Hillcrest Board presence at funerals and shiva calls for members and/or their families.

- The board will not meet in July.
- High Holiday mailings will go out in mid-August.
