VICE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I am now a first-time grandpa of a little baby boy. As his birth date approached, the world, as we know it, has gone crazy. The large majority of my family lives in Israel and I thank the Lord that we suffered no losses on October 7th as other families have.

Israel is being vilified as never before by many in the world who know nothing about the history of the land and its peoples. Israelis are accused of being colonizers and of running an apartheid state. I can only respond to these charges by saying that colonizers do not usually acquire land by paying for it, and an apartheid state (as in pre-Mandela South Africa) will usually force its inhabitants of different races and cultures to live separately. If you ever drive through various parts of Israel, you will come upon one Arab village after another, each with its own mosque and fluorescent green lighted minaret. You will encounter Bedouin nomadic settlements and you can have a very nice lunch in various Druse towns and villages as I did up near the Syrian border. None of these folks exist in a forced situation and they are all represented in the Knesset.

Under Turkish rule, Gaza was controlled by the Ottomans, after which it became part of the British mandate. The geographic borders between all nations in the Middle East have been fluid over the course of many years, depending on which army of which nation state was in control. One constant has been the multi-millennial presence of the Jewish nation in its ancestral homeland in Israel.

For the first time in my life, I will be part of the Salute to Israel Parade; proudly and defiantly marching up Fifth Avenue in support of my people and our homeland. Hopefully there will be a large turnout of Jews and supporters to counteract the anti-Israel protesters and antisemites who will be nearby in undoubtedly large and vocal numbers. Am Yisrael Chai!!

From Rabbi Kogan

Dear Friends of Hillcrest Jewish Center,

There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens:

a time to be born and a time to die,
 a time to plant and a time to uproot,
 a time to kill and a time to heal,
 a time to tear down and a time to build,
 a time to weep and a time to laugh,
 a time to mourn and a time to dance,
 a time to scatter stones and a time to gather them,
 a time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing,
 a time to search and a time to give up,
 a time to keep and a time to throw away,
 a time to tear and a time to mend,
 a time to be silent and a time to speak,
 a time to love and a time to hate,
 a time for war and a time for peace.

I have seen the burden God has laid on the human race. God has made everything beautiful in its time...

I hope you are familiar with above verse 3 in the Book of Ecclesiastes (Chapter 3). If you aren't, you should be. It is a classic and even Pete Seeger composed a song based on it (Turn, Turn, Turn).

The words of Ecclesiastes, attributed by Jewish tradition to King Solomon, have been quoted again and again, so that most of us understand – at least logically – that there is a time for everything.

The challenge, however, is not to know that there is a time for everything, but when that time is. For example, we know that there is a time to be silent and a time to speak, but when is the time to be silent and when is it to speak? When is the time to keep embracing, and when is the time to let go? When is the time to tear and when is the time to mend? When is the time for war and when is the time for peace?

In life, in the decisive moments in life, timing is everything.

Our sages teach us that peace is the greatest of all blessings. In fact, peace was a precondition for the giving of the Torah at Mt. Sinai when we became a people united by Torah. Only those who demonstrated a love of peace were worthy to receive the Torah. Indeed, peace is the Torah's highest priority, as it is written in our prayer book, "The whole Torah exists only to establish peace." According to **Pirkei Avot, The Sayings of our Ancestors**, peace is one of the three pillars that enable the world to endure. And it was one of our greatest sages, Hillel, who said, "the more Torah, the more life; the more justice, the more peace."

Peace is indeed one of the highest values in Judaism, to the extent, that Shalom – Peace – is one of the names of God. And yet, Ecclesiastes teaches us that there is a time for peace and a time for war.

The corollary of Ecclesiastes' teaching is that only fools propose peace when war is called for.

Israel is at war: at war with Hamas, at war with Hezbollah, at war with countless duplicitous antisemites across the globe. Israel is at war and must win the war! For Israel's allies, to try to impose peace at a time when war is called for, is reckless. For Israel, it could be, God forbid, suicidal.

Wars are never pretty; in wars people die, people suffer, and families are shattered. Israel and the Jewish people didn't ask for this war, but nevertheless, we will fight it.

Psalms 29:11 reads: *Hashem will give oz (strength) unto His people; Hashem will bless His people with peace (shalom).*

Strength is a precondition for peace. Now is the time for a show of strength. A time for peace, b'ezrat Hashem, will follow.

May Hashem give strength unto His people; may Hashem bless His people with peace.

MEMORIAL SCROLLS GATHERING IN NEW YORK

In the 1940's, the Nazi Governor of Czechoslovakia granted permission (Nes Qatan) to the Jewish Community of Prague to collect artifacts from synagogues across that nation. Some 100,000 objects including more than 2,000 Torah scrolls were stored away in many warehouses. After WW2 ended, these scrolls were found in deplorable condition with 1,550 being recoverable. They were purchased, brought to London UK, restored to ritual use if possible, and archived. The Memorial Scrolls Trust was established to distribute these Scrolls to synagogues around the world for remembrance and use in services.

In 1964, Scroll #327 made in 1780 for Nymburk, was sent to the Hillcrest Jewish Center. It is brought out of our Ark every Yizkor service to remind us of the lost Jewish communities. A plaque is on the south wall in the Mowshowitz sanctuary with further details and conditions of custodianship.

Upon the 60th anniversary of the arrival of the scrolls in London, a Gathering of Scrolls was held in Temple Emanu-El on April 7th. 63 Scrolls from New Hampshire to Philadelphia joined one from the Hillcrest Jewish Center to form a procession. It was my privilege to be asked by Rabbi Kogan to accompany him. The event included comments by Jeffrey Ohrenstein, Chair of the MST, and memorial prayers.
